**PRE-K APPLICATION SIGN-UP SESSIONS OFFERED BEGINNING FEBRUARY 18  
Now Accepting Applications for Durham County Pre-K Programs for 4-Year-Olds  
Scheduling Appointments for More at Four Program, Title 1 Pre-K and Head Start**

Durham—Beginning February 18, Durham's Partnership for Children More at Four Program, Operation Breakthrough Head Start, Durham's Alliance for Child Care Access and Durham Public Schools Title 1 Pre-K will be scheduling appointments with hundreds of families to apply 4-year-olds for a no cost pre-kindergarten program that provides quality experiences that enhance kindergarten readiness.

Families can apply in two ways:

- Schedule an appointment to apply for these programs by calling 403-6950 ext. 6852.
- Stop by the Head Start offices at 215 Seminary Street, Durham, NC (across from McDonald's and the YMCA) beginning Feb. 23, 2009. A Family Counselor will assist parents in filling out the application for the Pre-K programs.

The program is for children, age four, who have not been exposed to a preschool curriculum. To qualify for the programs, Durham County families must meet income guidelines and/or the child exhibits a developmental delay and children must turn 4-years-old by August 31, 2009 (born between October 17, 2004 and August 31, 2005) to be eligible for pre-k programs.

"All four organizations are working to ensure families experience the easiest application process possible," says Danielle Johnson, More at Four Coordinator. "Families no longer have to make separate appointments to apply for the programs. Children will be matched with the appropriate program based on their individual needs."

There are 13 private child care sites located throughout the county which participate in the More at Four Program. More at Four classrooms in Head Start and Durham Public Schools are based upon eligibility.

This pre-kindergarten initiative is community-based, voluntary, and designed to prepare 4-year-olds across the county for kindergarten with a focused curriculum that enhances children's development physically, socially, emotionally, mentally, which includes language, communication, cognitive, general knowledge and approaches to learning.

Applicants must provide a copy of the child's birth certificate, all family members' social security cards, immunization record, proof they reside in Durham County (utility bill, lease or mortgage contract), and proof of annual income (tax forms, check stub indicating hourly wage and number of hours worked).
