Durham Pre-K Open Application Day—March 21, 2009

Your 4-year-old child may be eligible to attend Durham County's More at Four Program, Head Start, and/or Durham Public Schools to prepare at-risk 4-year-olds for kindergarten.

Interviews and applications will be taken at the **Jim and Carolyn Hunt Child Care Resource Center, 1201 S. Briggs Ave. Durham, NC 27703 on Saturday, March 21, 2009 between the hours of 9:00 am to 1:00 pm.** Applications will be taken on a first come, first serve basis. For more information call 403-6950 x6852.

Children must be 4 years old by August 31, 2009 (born between September 1, 2004 and August 31, 2005) to be eligible for these pre-k programs.

Required materials needed from parents to apply:

- Copy of child's birth certificate.
- Copy of child's social security card, immigration number or other ID number as applicable.
- Current child immunization records.
- Proof of child's chronic health conditions, if applicable.
- Proof of IEP (Individualized Education Plan), if applicable.
- Proof of address in Durham County.
- Proof of all household income.
- If the parent/parents are students, proof of school enrollment, scholarship awards and grants.



Please remember: applications will not be processed without necessary documentation.
